From the Pastor

Dear St. Christopher's Family,

A number of years ago, it was a thrill to visit Trinity Episcopal Church, Copley Square in Boston. If you have been there, you know its imposing exterior and the feeling of being lifted up to heaven when you stand in the nave, looking up at the dome over the altar.

But, for me, the highlight was passing by the statue of Phillips Brooks, its Rector of many years, and later Bishop of Massachusetts. He had the spiritual gift of connecting the words of the Scripture to real life, making the Gospel accessible to people of all backgrounds.

We are indebted to him for one of our best-loved Christmas hymns, "O Little Town of Bethlehem. It contains phrases which ring on in our memories, such as this one: *But in thy dark street shineth the Everlasting Light, the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.*

As we face 2018, we may be in touch with fears of various kinds: for our world, for loved ones, for our own health and for what comes next for St. Christopher's. But the Christmas angels always begin their conversation with these words: *Do not be afraid! Why not, when it comes so easily to us?* we object. And the angels reply, "because the hope of all the years has come to you, journeys with you, holds you in his hands."

Jesus is our Emmanuel, God with us today and always.

Since this is true, there is always something to hope for in the coming year.

Phillips Brooks deeply understood this. He spoke these wonderful words on New Year's Eve, 1892, just prior to the last year of his ministry here on earth.

Oh Friends, the old year is fast slipping back behind us. We cannot stay in it if we would. We must go forth and leave our past. Let us go forth nobly. Let us go as those whom greater thoughts and greater deeds await beyond. Let us go humbly, solemnly, bravely . . . with firm, quiet serious steps, full of faith, full of hope, let us go to meet our Lord in this new year.

We are always living at the intersection of fear and hope, and, every day, our Emmanuel God offers a choice. Which way will you and I chose in 2018?

BOOKS

HIPPIE HOMESTEADERS by Carter Taylor Seaton was recommended to me by a friend who is very interested in art and true crafts. I was not very excited about reading it because I thought I knew all about the back to the land and arts and crafts movement in West Virginia. I was surprised to find that the book is very well researched and very well written. It tells of people who, for one reason or another, wanted to find a new way to live during a very turbulent time in our country. Many have left West Virginia now, because the back to the land movement is harder than people might think. But the people who stayed have contributed so much to the state and to the arts. Sometimes the artists and artisans have other careers and jobs, but they continue to remain somewhat true to their reason for going to West Virginia. Some live in modified homes at their original sites. Some have moved closer to civilization. But they make arts and crafts, and you can see much of their work at Tamarak, West Virginia's Cultural Center near Beckley, West Virginia. I have been there more than once, and the work to be viewed and, perhaps, purchased is amazing. I will be glad to lend the book to anyone who is interested.

A MOTHER'S RECKONING by Sue Klebold is heartbreaking. Her much loved child became a mass murderer in the Columbine massacre. Many people might think she just wanted to excuse his actions or take away all guilt from herself, but that is not true. While the Klebold family was quite normal, and there were no guns in the house and no support of guns, Dylan Klebold was able, in terrible frustration and depression, to be led into a nightmare. Sue Klebold does not ever say he could not help what he did. She does tell about her intense work to understand what happened and to understand mental illness. She has dedicated her life to trying to help others and find ways for people with brain disorders to fight discrimination and to find proper treatment. This book is a must for parents of teenagers, I think. You think your teenager's surliness and mood swings are just what teenagers go through. Sue Klebold thought so, too. Most of the time, Dylan was a sweet son. Some teens get through the pitfalls of high school, even bullying, just fine. Others don't. The author gives insight in what parents can do to understand the difference.

FATES AND FURIES by Lauren Groff is a really good read. It is the story of two people who meet, fall in love, etc. Well, you'll see. The plot is full of great twists and turns and almost no one is who he or she seems to be. This novel is pure enjoyment from start to finish. You won't be a better or worse person for having read it, but you will be highly entertained. Don't miss it.

FEAR OF DYING by Erica Jong is definitely a book for older adults. Although it is fiction, I would think it is also somewhat autobiographical since I know a little about her life. At least I have read a little about her life. Anyway (note that I did not use the current irritation to my senses that seems to permeate all written and spoken materials these days – anyways), Erica Jong tells many truths in her book. She says things that you have thought of but never vocalized, and she says truths that I, for one, have never thought but should have done so. I definitely recommend **FEAR OF DYING**.

AT THE EDGE OF THE ORCHARD by master story teller Tracy Chevalier is quite a tale that starts in Black Swamp, Ohio (the huge swamp that covered most of northwestern Ohio at one time) and ends in California. It is a story of hardship, family dysfunction, love, and apples. Yes, apples. Johnny Appleseed (John Chapman) makes appearances here and there. This is a work of fiction, but I would be surprised if you do not learn something. Enjoy AT THE EDGE OF THE ORCHARD.

Well, since I haven't written in two months, I have read about a zillion other things, but I can't seem to bring any to mind right now. This is enough. There will be more next month.

November 19, 2017

**Called to Order:** The meeting opened at 11:40 with a prayer by Junior Warden, Judy Brainard.

**Guest:** Lauren Faller, Convention Representative, gave vestry a cursory account of Cincinnati Convention Meeting.

Convention considered the following resolutions:
